

Individual Awards:

Wisconsin PVA will award the following prizes at this event:

High Overall Shooter

High Overall Wheelchair Shooter

ATA/PVA assigned class awards:

Singles – 100 targets, 1st & 2nd Places: \$100 & \$50 gift cards, and a plaque in each class.

Doubles – 50 pairs of targets, 1st & 2nd Places: \$100 & \$50 gift cards, and a plaque in each class.

Handicap by Yardage – 100 targets, 1st & 2nd Places: \$100 & \$50 gift cards, and a plaque in short, medium, long, and extra-long yardages.

Note: Only one individual award per shooter. Ties will be decided by longest run front to back in the event, handicap, doubles, singles, and coin toss. Top Gun will be decided by the longest run front to back in the handicap event, or in case of a tie, by coin toss.

Team Awards:

Chapter Team Awards for 1st and 2nd in all 300 targets. Each chapter may enter as many teams as it wants, but all team members must be members of the chapter.

Calcutta Bidding:

Each Calcutta-participating shooter registers by paying \$10. Bidding on shooters will be held on Saturday. Anyone can bid, with a minimum bid of \$10. The highest bidder wins a stake in the pot based on the shooter's performance. Any shooter who is not bid on agrees to pay \$10 as purchaser. The \$10 paid by the shooters and the total amount bid for all shooters will be the Calcutta pot. The top four places win 50%, 25%, 15%, and 10%, respectively, with 60% to the bidder and 40% to the shooter. Ties are divided. The outcome will be determined by scores on all 100 targets.

\$500 Silent Partner 50-Bird Event:

Each shooter participating pays \$10. The names are placed in a hat and drawn two at a time to make a partnership of two shooters. Each shooter will shoot 50 targets from the 27-yard line. The top scoring team will divide \$250. The 2nd, 3rd, and 4th high teams will divide \$125, \$75, and \$50, respectively. Teams with tie scores divide the prize money.

Silent Partner Competition:

On Saturday and Sunday, each shooter participating in the Silent Partner registers and pays \$10. The names are placed in a hat and drawn two at a time to make a partnership of two shooters. At the conclusion of each day's shooting, total scores by both members of each partnership will be used to determine the winners of the Silent Partner pot. The top four places win 50%, 25%, 15%, and 10% respectively. Shooters with tie scores will divide the prize money.

Directions:

From Airport to Hotel:

The Radisson Hotel is directly north of the airport. Leave airport parking area, cross Hwy 172 to Oneida Casino/Radisson Hotel.

From Hotel to Brown County Sportsmen's Club:

Turn left leaving hotel to Hwy 172. Proceed 3 miles to Hwy 41 North exit to Marinette. Go north on Hwy 41 for 8.25 miles to Lineville Road/Hwy M exit. Turn left on West Deerfield Road, go .25 mile, and take first right to Brown County Sportsmen's Club. Club phone number is 920-373-0947.

Transportation will be provided between the Radisson Hotel and Brown County Sportsmen's Club on Friday morning for practice and on both Saturday and Sunday for competition.

Liability Release & PVA Trapshoot Circuit Rules

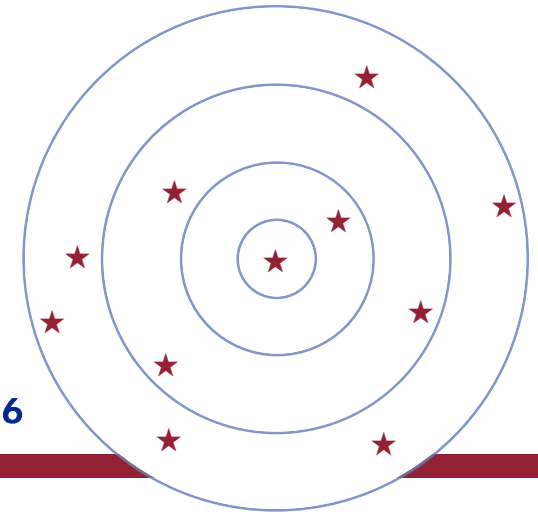

The Wisconsin PVA Pistol Shoot on Monday, July 26 will consist of 50 rounds of ammunition. Handguns/pistols will *not* be provided, so you must bring your own weapon to participate. No scopes or laser sights allowed, and nothing larger than .45 caliber will be authorized for competition. The use of two hands is ok, as is the use of a safety strap for all wheelchair shooters. However, hands and arms must be completely free of support. Individuals using a .22 caliber will be in a separate division for awards. Competition is open to all shooters, sitting or standing.

Advanced registration indicating the caliber of weapon you will be utilizing will be due to Wisconsin PVA no later than July 1, so that Wisconsin PVA will be able to provide proper ammunition. In addition, a limited selection of ammunition is available for purchase at the range. The pistol shoot is open to the first 25 registrants, and awards will be presented immediately after the pistol shoot is over.
